SALMON STAMPEDE

Out from Namu and neighbouring British Columbia
ports on Canada's north west coast, the world's biggest
salmon fleet begins its annual season. With a
winter of rationing ahead, Britain looks hopefully
towards Canada's great fishing and canning industry.
From these icy coastal waters come most of the
world's salmon.

Two months out of the year, salmon by the hundreds of thousands are caught and experted. Within 24 hours, salmon netted on this trip will be cleaned, canned and cooked. Highty per cent will come to Britain and European countries.

Canada's salmon catch this year is a two hundred per cent increase over 1944, but still pegged at 32 points a tin, salmon to the British housewife remains luxury eating.
