ATTLEE IN U.S.

At Washington's Airport, Mr. Attlee is welcomed by U.S. Secretary of State Byrnes; start of a crowded ten-days visit. Waiting to greet him at the White House was President Truman. With Canada's Mr. MacKenzie King, Mr. Attlee and Mr. Truman got down to their atom bomb talks in an atmosphere described as "businesslike, purposeful and most cordial." Climax of the P.M.'s visit was his speech to a joint session of Congress -

"We believe that we cannot make a heaven in our own country and leave a hell outside. In the light, the terrible light of the atomic bomb, that I have entered into discussion with your President in order that we may get together with all the nations of the world and consider what kind of a world it is necessary to have if civilization is to endure and if the common man in all lands is to feel secure."
