Almost every G.I. still in London was there to say Goodbye to Piccadilly. There was dancing for everybody who could find a bit of floor to stand on.

There was supposed to be a big ceremony of locking the doors but it misfired. Outside, a crowd of 5,000 people were trying to get in. The trumpet saved the situation.

When Rainbow Corner opened in 1942, they threw the only key away. From then on the door was always open. Now with a key made for the occasion, the door is locked for the first and last time. London's little America officially disappears, and Londoners (experiencing a sudden shortage of gas) good naturedly wonder if there's any connection. Open or shut, the street scene remains the same. While ever there's a G.I. in London, you'll know where to find him. Rainbow Corner lives on.
