In spectacular exhibition of forceful Rugby, Scotland (in white shorts) swamped Wales at Swansea by 25 points to six - a score that did no more than justice to the Scotsmen's superiority. Rugby fans have wondered how Scotland came to beat the match-winning New Zealanders recently. In this Swansea match they supplied the answer, and 30,000 Welshmen saw them do it.

In getting the ball from scrums and loose mauls, the Scots team were way on top and their speed was terrific.

With a sixteen point lead at half time, Scotland never looked back. Welshmen took heart from the magnificent play of their schoolboy halves, Wynford and Glyn Davies - only bright spot in a black day for Wales.

Scotland's three quarter movements were always dangerous. The Welsh defence took a lot of punishment in an all-out effort to keep the score down. At tackling and in the scrums the Welshmen gave as good as they got, but Scotland's terrier-like forwards were masters at everything else.

Wales have a big defeat to wipe out next time, but on this showing, Scotland's fifteen will take a lot of beating.
