Dr.Hill On my right is Dector Guy Dain, chairman of the British Medical Association, but you, the public, are interested in health no less than dectors, and in health services too. We all must better health services, and better health, but in organizing them let us make sure that your dector decon't become the State doctor, your servant become a Government servant,

Dr. D The new service must be certain to provide that both you and your dector are free to take full advantage of the service without Government or Civil Service interference. Your freedom means our freedom.

The Government's plan is described by Labour M.P. Dr. Maden Guest.

From the day when Parliament says the National Health Service is to come Dr. Guest into operation every man, woman and shild, every person young and ald, every person insured or not insured, will be able to get free medical attention. In the home, in a dector's surgery, or in the hespital, and if you need it you will get free speciality consultation, free special treatment in the hespital. The first thing to know is that the whole service, the dector in his surgery, the dector in your home, or the bed in the hespital if you need to go there, will be free. There will be no more doctors bills. Nothers of families need no longer be afraid to go to the dester for treatment. These who suffer from chronic women's ailments that many people suffer from, will have them prevented at an early stage. This alone will lift a heavy burden of anxiety upon many lives. There must be many of you listening to ne now as I speak to you through Pathe News, who know by bitter experience the facts of which I speak. The immediate benefit to children will also be very great. Early treatment will save many thousands of childrens' lives. It is the simple things the simple illnesses that effect shildren, measles, wheeping cough, cold in the chest that developes to pnoumenia, these are the causes of the death in the children. Let me remind you again what I said earlier to you, there will be no more dectors bills.
