Introducing his team is Derby's skipper Jack Hichelas, first second Captain to have the honour since the cap-final turnstiles last turned in 1939. This time a Derby player knocked the ball into his own not. One all and five minutes to go, and are the customers glad they get a ticket. Both sides played magnificant secon, here's Derby's Reg Harrison away ina grand burst. But Charlton's left-half Johnson has him marked for a fine tackle and clearance.

End of time and it's one all. And there's 30 minutes extra play and Derby gets away to an all-out left-to-right assemble on the Charles goal. The King and Queen and the Earl of Athlene, watch a great Cup Minal - and here's Derby's Second - a picture goal by red-headed inside-left Peter Bookety. Once in front, these boys take some stopping, and they're putting out the flags in Derby already.

With a two-one lead it's a new kind of Berky Bay and here's another. Centre-forward Stamp note Derky's number 3 - and does it get applause.

For the second half of extra time Charleton defend the left hand goal and it's in again with goalie Sem Bartram beaten after a grand dive. And every Derby hat goes in the six for a four-one victory.
