

### GARDEN OF REMEMBRANCE

A public garden of remembrance blossoms in St. James' churchyard, within a stone's throw of bustling Piccadilly Circus. Given by the late Lord Southwood on behalf of the Daily Mirror Herald, the garden commemorates the courage and fortitude of Londoners during the war. Memory slipped quickly back to October 1940 when, a 1,000 lb bomb destroyed the rectory and damaged the church. The Verger and his wife were killed, and the same night incendiaries burnt out the interior of the 260 year-old Wren church. A solitary tree survived and the famous ornamental, wrought-iron gates were carefully preserved. Today, they are restored to their old place for the official opening by Queen Mary of the Garden of Remembrance.
