

## PARIS VICTORY PARADE

A short head in front of London, Paris puts on her Victory Parade. Hub of all the ceremonial is the Arc de Triomphe as columns of men and armour deploy down the famous Avenue de la Grande Arce and Champs Elysee. British, French and American troops figure prominently among the massed columns, pictured by Pathe newsmen stationed on top of the Arc.

In Paris for the Big Four meeting Mr. Bevin had a ringside seat as infantrymen step out in the march past.

American military-police - known over here as Eisenhower's snowdrops - go through a tricky piece of manoeuvring.

Contingents of many French colonial regiments brought pageantry and colour. Reminiscent of France's great peace-time parades, their magnificent military bearing has survived the camouflage-drabness of modern war.

Britain's Royal Welsh Fusiliers brought along their goat mascot to add another success to his many campaigns. Another hardened veteran was a ram - so well trained that he leads his platoon without a guide.

First to go ahead with Victory Parades, France gives us a preview of London's celebrations on June the 8th.
