After war, the peacemaking. This time, we seek more than the redrewing of frontiers and the punishment of guilty nations. Statemen talk but do you remember, in these pictures from 1919, how they talked in the dail of Mirrors at Versaillos? Sincere men made a peace there but there were to be other Conferences, seen in these League of Nations pictures from Geneva. There, tjore were other men. Remember Prance's sinister Pierre Laval? From 1918, to 1939, there was no lack of Conferences. There was also this — Men of action, gangature masquerading as politicians. Demite Mussolin and the runting Anstrian Corporal. They satisfied a lust for power while the men of peace looked on — and talked. The race to war began here when the Maxis took over Austria. And after it all, the blood and toil, the sweat and tears of war at last brought are ther peace and yet another conference.

But today, while this very Conference sits in Peris, while mena are talking of the way to peace - there is still this. In Amentina, the menace of militaristic, minders General Peron.

Spain's Concral France, Europo(s last Pascist Dictator, maintains his rule by force,

From Triests, a new name, Tugoslavias Mashal Tite. Strongly comsured by America and Britain, Tite's Tugoslas frontiers are new sterm-contros, new danger-spets for Britain's soldiers. And from India, civil war talk by Moslom Leaders has provoked more terrors.

Lastly China, First to suffer war, last to know peace.
The common peoples fought not for hatred but for humanity. Let
the Stateman call a halt. Let them consider where they are leading.
A world can be created, on humanity, justice and peace. Remember,
it must be One World - or none.
