MATTHEWS AGAIN!
SPURS V. STOKE

First talking point from this year's revived F.A. Cup came from the Spurs-Stoke soccer battle. Press critics started the argument by penning Stanley Matthews. They said he played a poor game and Spurs defender Rennie Burgess was too much for him. Pathe Cameras saw it differently. Here is Matthews - No. 7 in stripes - and just watch him go.

The man with the magic feet is still England's outside-right number one.

Here hard-pressed Spurs defenders pass up the field to Dix - No. 10 at inside-left. For him and the other Tottenham forward it was all or nothing. With inside-right Bennett, veteran Dix was the mainstay of the Spurs attack.

Stoke scored twice - here's number one - with Spurs half Ludford putting the ball through his own goal.

Stoke's second came from Matthews' pass to right-half Frank Mountford. From now on, up go soccer temperatures. Cup fever is back.
