## ROYAL TOUR

From the Royal Family's African Diary - a visit to the colony of Merthern Rhodesia. Paddling along the 1,600 mile long Zambesi (the third longest river in Africa) are the men of the Baretse tribe. Paramount Chief Imwiko, enthroned amidships under a white canepy, is the ruler of the Baretse people. Forty Indanas wearing buckskins, lion manes and red turbens had brought the state barge 300 miles down the river. Beating on their drums, the native musicians create the rhythm to which the Indunes paddle the barge.

Barotseland is a semi-independent native reserve extending over 288,000 square miles in the fertile Zembesi Valley. In the extreme west of Northern Rhodesia, it is bordered by the Belgian Congo.

Presiding over the African Indaba, the King presents a silver medallien and a seroll of honour to Chief Imwiko. To the Royal Family the Barotse Chief expressed the greetings of his people.
