At the 10th England-France soccer International at Highbury, the only bright spots in a dull game were French goalie Da Rui's play, and the three England goals which gave us a three nil victory. Here's the first one - Tommy Lawton passes to Preston's Tom Finney who slams it into the net.

Rough tackling by the French handicapped England. But in the second half, the English inside trio, Carter, Lawton and Mannion really got moving, well supported by Finney.

A faulty French clearance and Middlesbrough's Wilf Mannion scores goal No. 2 with an overhead kick.

Taking it all round it was one of the poorest internationals we've seen. Enlivened only by occasional individual flashes. Derby's silver haired Raich Carter scored the third goal for England who remain unbeaten at home in International soccer.

At Wembley, 80,000 spectators were there for the Rugby League Cup Final - a record crowd. It was an all Yorkshire battle - Bradford Northern, in white shirts with hoops, beating Leeds by 6 points to 4. Leeds, reached the final without having a point scored against them. And here they had the better part of the game in the first half.

Bradford's Walters completes a round of passing to make the score two all. The final score was 8-4 and the cup goes to Bradford Northern.
