

THE WINDSORS ARRIVE

At Southampton, we meet the 85,000 ton liner "Queen Elizabeth" on her arrival from New York. Aboard were the Duke and Duchess of Windsor. They are here for a short stay. During the Windsor's last visit in October some of the Duchess's jewels valued at £20,000 were stolen. Special police precautions are being taken during their present stay. After posing for photographs, the Duke and Duchess left Southampton for Sunninghill in Berkshire.

At Charters, near Sunninghill the Windsors are staying at the home of millionaire widow Mrs. Frank Parkinson.

John Parsons of Pathe News was waiting to meet the Windsors at the ~~bank~~ invitation of their hostess. The Duke refused a request for a sound interview, spending most of the time talking about the Grand National which he saw in Pathe News in New York.

The Duchess wore a grey two piece costume with fox fur and blue accessories. Her tiny, back-of-the-head hat was held in place by a silk turban scarf. After a three week stay they leave for Southern France. Asked if he was thinking of settling down in England The Duke said it was a possibility. But (as for everyone) it's a question of finding a home.
