go out to bat against South Africa on the last day of the Test. With
England 47 runs behind in their second immings, it was up to these two
to save the match. Compton sneeks a single to get his first Test
century of the season. The 29 year eld Middlesex batman, Arsenal
and England footballer, is the first criskster to get 1,000 runs this
year. His was a fighting immings - probably the greatest of his career.
Demis Compton played his first Test Match when he was 19, also seering
a century. With his score at 165, he was caught by Mitchell from a
ball by Mann. His record stand of 237 with his skipper, Nomen Yardley,
saved England from defeat. The 32 year old Yorkshiruman played a real
captain's game. Seering 99, he had bad luck when he was caught by
Tuchett. It was his first Test in England after his great Austmium
performance. Compton and Yardley with Kent's Codfmy Evens, saved
England from a humiliating defeat. At Lords the position may be
different.

Feed for Britain! From Australia come these pictures of Devemport school children bringing their gifts for the mother country. One mile of food is to be placed on the pavements of the Tamamian town's main street.
