At Brighton, Cliff Anderson, the boxer from British Guiana, gets into fighting trim for his bout with Al Phillips. Three months ago, Anderson lost to the Aldgate boxer on a narrow points verdict. At Olympia, the two boxers meet again.

The British Boxing Board of Control does not permit a coloured man to fight for a British title. A British boxer can take a title from a coloured fighter, if he can.
