Glasgow Horse Show

Glasgow's White City Stadium sees the Scottish Championships Horse Show. In the open jumping competition - here is Glasgow's Elizabeth Fumhall on Stepps going round the course. Lord Inverclyde was among the spectators.

Royal Visit to Scotland

To Edinburgh - in their first visit to Scotland since the announcement of Princess Elizabeth's engagement to Lieutenant Philip Mountbatten - comes the King and Queen and their two daughters. At Princes Street Station, Lord Provost, Sir John Falconer, greets their Majesties. The Queen introduces him to their future son-in-law.

Historic Holyroodhouse is their home during their stay in Scotland. From it, on the second day, Princess Elizabeth and her fiance enter Edinburgh's Usher Hall. Before an assembly representing every Scottish City, burgh and county, the heiress to the throne receives the Freedom of Edinburgh. Reports say that before his marriage, Lieutenant Philip may be raised to the peerage as Duke of Edinburgh. Welcoming the Princess to the city, the Lord Provost says:
