At London's White City Stadium, Britain's athletes have their final big tussle with foreign competitors in a rehearsal of next year's Olympic Games. In the pole vault Doncaster's Johnny Dodd fails to clear 11ft 3. Winner is Hungary's Zaitway with a jump of 12½ ft. British successes came in the sprints. Trinidad's coloured flying streak, McDonald Bailey once again lived up to his reputation. He almost sailed ahead in the 100 yards. There is no one to touch him in Europe today. Our brightest hope for an Olympic win, Bailey equalled the three A's record of 9 point 7 seconds. Mac completed the sprint double, winning the 220 yards in 21 point 7 seconds.

McDonald Bailey is now out to bring the world record and the Olympic championship to Britain. He has a good chance to bring it off.
