Spotlight on Coal. At Durham, in the heart of the coal country, 120,000 miners and their families join the procession -with brassbands and banners - opening the year's biggest Miners' gala. At the eleventh hour in Britain's fuel crisis, three Cabinet Ministers went North to help boost the drive for more coal.

Over a hundred miners' Lodge Banners are carried to the race course, where, close by the emblem of the Morrison Lodge, Britain's Lord President of the Council tells listening miners: "You can do the job. You can save the country."

Taking it all in is Mr. Dalton. There, too, among the ministers was the third - the Foreign Secretary. With world diplomacy on his mind Mr. Bevin asked miners "For weapons so that I can carry on and try and complete a decent peace for the world."
