With thousands locked out, Pathe's cameramen got in to record the Yorkshireman's great come-back. But not before South Africa had opened the batting before a record 39000 crowd. This is Mitchell taking three off the England attack. His stand of 90 - with Hounse - pulled the tourists out of a bad start.

And here's Edrich putting down a fast one.

Fullerton batted bravely, but the tourists - 175 all out - netched their lowest Test score this year.

England at the wicket, and all Yorkshire's fingers crossed for Hutton. Here's Washbrook - back into form too with 75 - of the opening stand of 141.

Can Hutton do it? That's the crowd's one thought. And here's Len himself, well on the way to the century that proved he's back on his old form.

Pathe's long-range camera gives a close-up of the cricket master's feetwork. And the wrists which are scoring again - all round the wicket. Good news for Yorkshire. A god sign for England's Test hopes against Australia next year.
