Marseilles

Three Jewish repatriation ships at anchor off Port Du Bouc, France, set a new Jewish problem. Food supplies for the 4,500 would-be illegal immigrants - who at first declared they would die before leaving the ships - received top priority.

Several sick cases were reported among the passengers. Ships carrying medical supplies from the Red Cross and French doctors, were among the first to approach.

From the Bagnyade Park (one of the three ships) sick passengers are taken off while on shore their relatives wait to greet them. The refugees first left France on the "Ezras 47." The Navy frustrated their attempt to land in Palestine and the Government ordered them back to France. Now the deadlock has eased. The major Palestine problem remains unsolved.
