Belgian Congo

With unrest brewing elsewhere among Colonial possessions overseas, the tour of the Belgian Congo by the Regent, Prince Charles, is the latest sign of Europe's determination to secure her frontier-beyond-the-sea.

At Paulis, in Stanleyville, Prince Charles was presented with gifts by local chiefs. In scenes vividly recalling our own Royal Family's Tour of the native African states, he was met everywhere with similar demonstrations of loyalty.
