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AROUND SCOTLAND

Himburgh stages Scotland's first International Music and Brana Festival. To the beflagged streets of Scotland's expital have come 120,000 visitors. Girls from Morwey, Turkey, South Africa, France and Greece are among them. These two come from Palestine - others have travelled from Sierra Leone and the West Indies. Edinburgh's aim is to be the Salsburg of the post-war world - the new world sentre for all art levers. If istoric St. Giles Cathedral - Mother Kirk of Edinburgh - is the setting for the inauguration coronary of the festival. 200 of the city dignituries go from the City Chambers to the Cathedral for the opening service.

Edinburgh hopes to make the festival an annual event.

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At Arbundh Abbay in the year 1320 the Scottish Barons in Parliament signed and scaled the Declaration of Scottish Independence, Today, Arbunath I.H.C.A. stages a pageont to celebrate that historic occasion. All the players are townsfelk. Robert Bruce, King of Scotland, and Abbot Bernard de Linton were the two main figures six conturies ago,

Of the Abbey, only the walls now remain. Founded by King William the Liam, it was destroyed three times, the last time during the Reformation. The signing of the Declaration of Independence here has given Arbreath and its Abbey a permanent place in the history books. King Rober the Bruse, accompanied by his Barons leaves. The declaration remains within the Abbey.
