Troops were brought out printeges the police and whilst so official information is available it is estimated that the number of people killed on that day from stabbings, rioting and the law ran into three figures.

The following day there was more looting and Dioting which was effectively deals with by the military. The outbursts during the day were on a fairly small scale - inclining to flare up more at night.

Many Muslims were evacuated by the military who have got the situation under control.

Business life has been tempoyarily disorganised. Hespitals and refugee camps have been established in very quick time.

It can be said that prompt action by the leaders has got the situation under controls

## EEMARES

All the above shots and especially those marked (see below) were taken under extreme difficulties. There has been no transport provided, all taxis are off the road. I hired a car and drove myself, but there has been plenty of epposition from those in charge of police. One one occasion I was ordered to leave and given three minutes or I would be fired on. The shots whilst the ricts were actually taking place had to be taken very hurriedly as the sight of assuers made the rictors very heatile as twice I had to drive away in a great hurry.

Note: The Delhi aughorities are doing their best to cope with the refugee problem within their walls - there are at least 10,000 with in Furana Qila camp.

REMARKS: Furana Qila is known in Delhi as the Old Fort, ... it was built about 1541 and is one of the best preserved of the ruins near Delhi and lies about two miles south of the city. In all Delhi has been rebuilt eight times, the eighth being New Delhi, the seventh Bld Delhi, and the sixth Purana Qila.
