tons of coal which have fallen off during leading. After twenty years, the water is now being dredged. Huge pumps lift the mud from the bottom and pipe lines carry it to a waste site in the town. There, Bremen citizens gather the coal out of the mud.

One persons can reclaim nearly three hundredweights of coal daily. Those near the front have a better chance - but even at the back the search is still fruitful.

Although coal production in the Ruhr is improving, Germany again faces a bleak, fuel-less winter. This is the people's way of overcoming another hardship. But the week's news also brought a langh.
