THERE'S MARY A SLEP

Charlton's hopes of retaining the Cup slip when Skipper Johnson loses the toss on Huddersfield's neutral ground. A 35,000 crowd sees the cup-holders on the attack against the favourites, dark-shirted Manchester United. But Charlton's goalie, San Bartram, is soon on the defensive against the Manchester forward line.

Winger Gordon Hurst, No. 7 is the Londoners' finest attacker but, much to Charlton fans disgust, Manchester's defence completely cramps his style. A deflected long-shot by wing-half Warmer tricks Bartram "and - it's a goal!"

A powerful kick by centre-forward Rowley again tests Lanky Sam - and the match becomes a Bartran sole against the Manchester eleven. Jimmy Delamey is the chief attacker in the second-half, but the cup-holders' goalie stays on top, even when the Scottish international comes back for more.

Johnny Morris starts a mid-field movement that makes "rings" round the Gharlton defence. The ball goes out to winger Delamey. From his centre, Mitten heads goal No. 2.

Manchester United stay Cup favourites. Deprived of the trophy, Charlton's chief asset is acrebatic goalie Bartram.
