## THE LINCOLN SHIER HANDECAP

Lincoln (adding the beauty of a spring day to the thrill of 1948's first big race) invites the crowd to its Carboln course. Pathe News (invited by the Stewards Coumittee to film the official record of the Lincoln Handicap) catches the season's first glimpse of the little men who make big race news.

Gerden Richards (by new a British institution as champion jeebey)tips the scales his usual weight. 57 other jeebeys weigh in too for a record field which gives punters and tipsters the chance to catch the bookies at long odds.

The long string of throughbreds heads for the starting gate, with the French bred horse "Clarion the Third" earrying the weight of the groud's money.

Now they're at the starting gate. 58 horses with jockeys stirrup to stirrup across the course but a nice steady line. Pirat horse to clear stands the best chance in the flying mile. They'll get away new I think, yes they're racing. This is the scene (recerded by Pathe's mobile cameraman from the Lincoln readway) as the field thunders away on its eight furleng course. In the lead is "Glever Lad," followed by "Saludin," "Glem Sheilister" and Boes Gorse."

With half a mile to go, it's still anybody's race. But breaking from the pack is "Commissar" a 35 to 1 shot ridden by Bill Rickarby. Yes, "Commissar" is shead, beating back a challenge from the French favorate "Clarien 111." The winning poet's in sight and it's "Commissar's" race. So for the first time, an eight year old wins the season's first Classic.
