Glasgow

Britain's holiday soccer parade draws a 3 million crowd - it's highlight is played off in Glasgow. 143,000 Scotsmen at Hampden Park stadium to see White sleeved Hibernian kick off against Glasgow Rangers in the semi final of the Scottish cup.
