BANS CRUNCHILL

At the Hague are gathered 800 delegates representing 23 European nations. Men and women of all walks of life, they (like France's wartime Premier Edward Baladier) have some to seek the first United States of Europe. The Butch Royal couple - welcoming Mrs. Gaurchill and Anthony Eden - greet the delegates, who include Leslie Heare Belisha. Not sponsered by any one government - yet willed by every nation - the Hague meeting seems to the people of Europe another groping but positive step for peace. Winsten Churchill - in his role as world statesmen - presides over the inaugural session. Party politics are thrust into the background as the man who gave Europe back its freedem receives the acolaim of its representatives.

In the countries around them - the Hagus delegates see other hepeful signs for a United Europe - the Five Power Alliance signed at Brussels last month - above all, the composite co-operation created by the Marshall Flam mations. As France's ex-Socialist Premier Ramadier addresses the conference, it becomes clear that this movement is one that transcends all parties and all frontiers.

In this medieval Hall of Knights, Belgium's ex-Premier Van Zeeland addresses the delegates. As he speaks, the plan for the continent's federation becomes brighter.
