4TH ANNIVERSARY OF D-DAY  
-----

At the occasion of the fourth anniversary of D-Day, President Auriol and a diplomatic party made a four-day tour of the battlefields of Normandy.

Continuity of scenes:

CAEN: The President of the Republic, accompanied by the Prefect of Calvados and the mayor of the town of Caen, visited the Castle of Guillaume the Conqueror and the future reconstruction plan of the town was explained to him.  
Shots of the streets of Caen with cathedral on the background.  
Prison of Caen where 70 patriots have been killed on June 6, 1944.  
Flowers are put on the commemorative stone.  
On the Republic Square, President Auriol remitted the Legion of Honor to the town of Caen - Parade.

ARROMANCHES: At the artificial port of Arromanches, called Port Winston and of the type Mulberry, the debarkment started on June 6th with 12,000 tons of goods and 2,500 trucks.  
Flowers are put on the American monument.

The President visited the British cemetery where are 5,700 British soldiers. With him are: British Ambassador Sir Oliver Harvey, Admiral Martin Dumbharhasermith - Canadian Ambassador General Vanier.

OMAHA BEACH: Shots of Mr. Jefferson Caffery.

PORT-EN-BESSIN: Trawlers are leaving the harbour in presence of the President, the Ambassadors of Great Britain, United States and Canada.
