## MOUNTBATTER HOROURED AT CARTER CEREMONY

At Windser, a service of Thanksgiving on the six hundredth anniversary of the Foundation of the Order of the Garter is attended by the King, as Severeign of the Order, the Queen and the Knights and officers.

The magnificent robes, the outward signs of chivalry which date from the days of Edward the Third, bear little affinity to the austorities of life in modern Britain.
