WORLD GRANARY FILLS UP

Experienced hands test the first hard grains of the Kansas wheat crop. Already the farmers bins are full. The piles of grain swell into hills on the open ground. Giant combine harvesters move on towards the heart of the great wheat belt which runs Northwards through America's Midwest to the wide Canadian plain of Manitoba. The world's grain harvest is under way.

Signs of a bumper yield bring encouragement to a world which stands in need of good news. Under the terms of a five year agreement Australia, Canada and the United States will export five hundred million bushels of Wheat. Of this, Britain is to receive one hundred and eighty millions, ninety per cent of her requirements. But with continuing good weather the wheat belt surplus is predicted at a far higher figure....so for us, in Britain, the B.U. should be gone for good. The world's granary fills up, and (for the first time in history) under a plan which lays the foundation for stable production and fair disposal of man's most vital need.
