ARABIA'S MYSTERY MAN ARRIVES

A French airliner brings to London a Briton who, to the Arabs is "The Father of the Little Jam." John Bagot Glubb, who, as Glubb Pasha, commands the elite Arab Legion, arrives with his family on a fortnight's leave from troubled Palestine. 51-years-old, this mild-mannered looking desert soldier fits ill into civilian clothes and is more at home in his Jerusalem Headquarters. There, earlier in the week, in his uniform of a Transjordan Major-General, he spoke on behalf of all the Arab States when Count Bernadotte, the United Nations mediator - arrived for further peace talks.

Trusted by all Arabs - the man who follows in the footsteps of another great Briton, Lawrence of Arabia - today represents the major power in the Middle East. His legion of fearless Bedouin volunteers - is the most efficient fighting force East of Gibraltar. With his men entrenched in the old city of Jerusalem, the influence of Glubb Pasha will continue to be felt in the affairs of the Holy Land.
