On Saturday, September 11th, a disasterous fire ruined a refrigerating-house at Amsterdam, the largest one of Europe. Owners are the old-dock company "Blauwhoedenveem - Vriesse-veem". The two storehouses "Amerika" and "Australië" are separated by a fire-proof wall; "Australië" alone could be antel.

The losses are: butter, 1.100.000 Kilogrammes; fish, #5x4000x 450.000 K.G.; ment 120.000 K.G.; fruit and vegetables 112.000 K.S. and 4500.000 eggs. All these articles were stored in "Amerika" and destined for expert.

During the extinction workmen and firemen saved goods from "Australië"; till now it was impossible to state the damage and the losses of this refrigerating-house. The fire broke out at about 5 o'clock a.m. and was not extinguished till Tuesday morning.
