Big time meter racing makes a comeback at Goodwood. With famed pre-war racing centres like Brooklands and Bonnington Fark still out of action, it falls to a disused fighter acrodrome near glorious Goodwood's racecourse to put on Britain's first meter race for 10 years. Drivers like Prince Bire of Siam (lacking encouragement here and ferced to compete abread) make a welcome return to a British track. Anything that moves is good enough for the bookies. This is where they recemp those famous Loger lesses. Twelve supercharged racers line up for the main event of the day - the Goodwood Trophy - five laps of two and a half miles.

As they thunder round for the second lap, a Maserati - No. 25 driven by Reg Parnell, leads the field.

Last lap coming up and the 40,000 grows is hearse with excitement as Parnell in his Mascrati races here to win the Goodwood Trophy and Britain's first post-war motor race.
