BRADMAN SAYS GOODBYE

In the grounds of Balmoral Castle, the greatest cricketer of our time - Donald George Bradman, 40-year-old skipper of Australia's Test team - bids farewell to the King and Queen, to Britain and to first class cricket. The game will be the poorer for his leaving.
