### SCOTLAND WIN AT CARDIFF

Scotland - in dark shirts - kick off against Wales in the season's first international at Cardiff. Against the tested and experienced home-side, Scotland's untried youngsters - with seven new caps - show that they have the makings of a great team. From old-timer Davie Shaw, No. 3, to newcomer Lawrie Reilly, No. 9, this Scots team is full of the pep needed to win an international championship. A foul leads up to their first goal. Challenged by Reilly and Steel, goalie Sidlew can't stop the free-kick rolling into the net.

Encouraged by the 60,000 home crowd, Wales hit back. From winger Thomas, the ball goes to Arsenal's Bryn Jones, who slams it hard into the net.

With the score level, Scotland's superiority begins to tell. Yet it's another free-kick, disapproved by the crowd, that gives them the lead - Willie Waddell finishing off Kelly's kick.

Architect of the Scottish triumph is Derby's Billy Steel - No. 10. A brilliant schemer, it's from his pass to winger Johnny Kelly, No. 11, that the Scots make certain of their win - with Glasgow's Willy Waddell again the scorer. Turning down heated protests by the Welsh team (whose claim that the ball had not crossed the line is supported by a flagging linesman) Irish referee Maxwell awards Scotland a goal - and with it their first win over Wales for ten years.
