The bells of the Abbey which a year before had seen a royal wedding, carolled a royal birth.

At Queen Charlotte's Hospital, a day forever honoured by the impartial hand of time marked the happiness of other couples - seven babies sharing almost to the minute the royal birthday.

A year, all but six days, since the citizens of London acclaimed the newlyweds at the Palace Balcony, the nation shared anew the pride of the Prince and Princess.
