EUROPEANS FLEE CHINA

As Communist forces threaten to engulf all thina, the evacuation of European civilians from the danger some begins in earnest. The first beatload of refugees is bid a sad farewell by these left behind. There are 900 aboard (Britens among them) all fleeing a troubled land. But, as they leave, others nove in. The Ninth American Marine Division from Guan arrives at Eming-Ene. They are here to enforce the American Gerrison, mernally stationed at this Yellow Sea part. Thing-Ene is held by Nationalists, but completely surrounded by Reds. As the Marines' commander steps ashere, the big query is whether his troops would go into action against the Ommunists, if they should attempt to onpture the city.

With commanist forces threatening to overran all China, with the mational government's capital city of Wanking itself in peril - the evacuation of U.S. civilians has already begun. The second boatload of American refugees is bid a sad farewell by those left behind. Of the mine hundred abeard, seven hundred are the wives and children of Unity Army personnel. But even as they leave, the Minth Division of U.S. Marines from Guam moves into Teing-tao. They're here to reinforce the Marine garrison, already stationed at this port on the Yellow Sea. Tsing-tao is a nationalist-held pocket, completely surrounded by the communists -- but so far the Reds have made no effort to interfere with the city. The Marines' job is to protect American interests and American nationals, who are already evacuating the port in a steady stream. Colonel Hughes, leading the Minth, is first to step ashore to meet Brigadier General Thomas, marine commander at Tsing-Tao. The marines stand

guard at a trouble spot in troubled Chins.
