

INDIANS HONOUR GANDHI'S MEMORY

Gandhinagar - or Gandhi's town - a newly built city three miles from Jaipur - is the setting of India's first national Congress since Independence Day. To commemorate this historic occasion, a colourful two-mile procession - depicting every aspect of life in India - is cheered by densely-packed sightseers through Jaipur's streets.

Near the centre of Gandhinagar, the new Congress President, Doctor Sitaranaya, unveils a giant statue of Mahatma Gandhi, assassinated eleven months ago that day. India's new leaders honour the man whose death in his country's gravest hour united a strife-torn nation.
