CANADIAN PARLIAMENT OPENS

The new session of Canada's Parliament opens in Ottawa. Lord Alexander, the Governor General, is welcomed by Prime Minister St. Laurent. For the first time in history, newsreel cameras are permitted inside the House. The Sergeant-at-Arms, bearing the Black Red, knocks on the deer of the Commons, ammounting the arrival of the Governor-General (official representative of the King) and bringing his summens for members to attend at the bar of the Senate.

In the Senate, known as the Red Chamber, the Governor-General reads the speech from the threme. Lord Alexander calls for a policy to secure world peace, and praises Mr. McKensie King, the retired premier, for his distinguished services to Canada and the world.
