

GLASGOW'S GIFT FOR PRINCE PHILIP

A proud day for Glasgow. Lord Provost Sir Hector McNeil looks over the city's wedding present to Princess Elisabeth and Prince Philip - a completely furnished dressing room for the Duke. Contributed by the pence and pounds of Glasgow citizens, the gift is an all-Scottish achievement. Designed by Neil Morris, 31-year-old Glasgow furniture-maker, the room is to be completely panelled in white Scottish sycamore, with the suite itself of the same material.

Built by Scots craftsmen, like Bob McCafferty, this truly Royal gift has taken 70 men more than 9 months to complete. Experts like Tom Partridge, a cabinet maker for 20 years, help to make it a present worthy of a Duke.
