Manking, capital of China, nervously awaits the Communist Army, encomped only ten miles outside the city. Only Chiang-Kai-Shek's successor, acting President Li-Tsung-Man (and Char-Chang-Nei), his chief advisor, remain in the city to represent the Government.
