The world's biggest jet-propelled aircraft - takes off from Muroc Lake, Celifornia, headed non-stop for Washington, twenty-two hundred miles away.

As the tailless Northrop bomber speeds eastward its eight jets blaze fantastic patterns across the skies.

The hundred-ton bomber flies at tremendous altitudes. This is how a big city looks at forty thousand geet.

A six-man crew brings the giant into Andrews Field four hours and twenty-five minutes after takeoff to set a new mark for heavy bombers of five hundred and eleven miles an hour.
