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RECORD ORDERS FOR BRITISH TOTS

At Birmingham, the Toy Fair beats the big drum for British ingenuity and manufacturing skill. Here's one for Mr. Strashey inevitably deemed to coming nationalisation. But as most exhibits are for expert only, it's the kids who really suffer. Over a hundred British toy firms contributed, and 60,000 overseas buyers are expected. Record orders are pouring in.

The walking dell - sister to another which sings and reads the news - does everything bar the washing-up. It's so human it's frightening.

For budding virtuenes there's a 2-foot baby grand. £25, but expert only. Miniature pinne - midget noter. The Miniear, ene-and-aguarter herse-power, three-wheeler produced by Preston designer Lawrence Bend, takes the read at a farthing-a-mile. Britain's cheapest car (just under £200) has 4,000 overseas orders already lined up. It packs a single-cylinder, 2-strake engine nounted on the front wheel. Top speed 50, a hundred miles to the gallon. Would you like it wrapped, or will you earry it?
