Anna Strong, expelled from Russia on spy charges, lands in New York and is promptly subpoenaed to appear before the Federal Grand Jury investigating Communist espionage. Long a friend of Russia, mystery-woman Strong taught Trotsky English and founded Moscow's first English-language newspaper.

In Brussels, a crowd of ten thousand - liberally sprinkled with Communists - give Winston Churchill the noisiest meeting of his career. Though welcomed by the vast majority Red rowdies do their best to break up the rally. Britain's Opposition leader is speaking on the United Europe Movement.

Five hundred police vetted the audience before hand, but some Communists succeed in gatecrashing and are promptly thrown out. Premier Spaak backs Winston Churchill when he declares that only a United Europe can give the world hope of peace. Despite heckling, Churchill valiantly carries the day.
