

ROYAL VISITORS IN LONDON AND EDINBURGH

At King George the Fifth Dock, London - just before her maiden voyage to Australia - "Port Brisbane," new 12,000-ton motor-vessel, is inspected by the Queen and Princess Margaret.

The Queen's standard is hoisted as the royal visitors come aboard. This latest addition to the Merchant Fleet has luxury quarters for her crew and refrigeration plant designed to bring eggs, meat and butter - a welcome sign of better times coming.
