STORM SESSIONS AHEAD FOR U.N.O.

To Flushing Meadows, New York, come the delegates of the United Nations for the resumption of the third General Assembly, adjourned from Paris. The newly-signed Atlantic Pact overshadows all business on the agenda, and although there are perfunctory handshakes between East and West, Mr. Bovin and the British delegation know that the eleavage between the Powers is wide. Dashing the world's high hopes, the United Nations, after starting off to a new beginning in open diplomacy, is new an instrument of political warfare. Br. Evatt, the President of the session, knows that once again Mr. Growke, will vete indiscriminately any proposal not to the Soviet's liking. For the delegates of the 58 nations represented here, weeks of storny debate lie shead.
