SHEEP EPIDENIC - SHEPHERDE ACT

Disaster threatens in John Peel's country, as Southern Lakeland sees the biggest round-up in history, following a reported outbreak of sheep scab. The mountains of Ennerdale echo the flock master's call

A deadline is set for 35,000 sheep to be driven in after the long months grazing on the open hillside. Carried out under pelice supervision, the operation is ordered at a critical hour for shepherds. If the outbreak reaches the pitch of an opidemie, consequences may be dire, since the lambing season is near. From Britain's loveliest peaks - Pillar Rock, Great Gable, Scafell Pike - the semi-wild Hordwick sheep are gathered into peaks to await inspection by Ministry vets.

A dip in time may yet save thousands of sheep, otherwise doomed to compulsary destruction. Many flocks, decimated by the great winter freene-up of two years ago, have only <u>now</u> begun to recover their numbers. At stake is a valuable source of woel and food for the nation, besides the livelihood of scores of small shepherd-farmers. In this war-without-guns in the lemely fells, may success attend the swift action of the good and vigilant shepherd.
