

BRITISH TROOPS INSTRUCT WESTERN UNION POWERS

At Weybourne Camp, near Norwich, crack heavy anti-aircraft gunners give a farewell performance before leaving for the Low Countries to instruct Dutch and Belgian gun-crews. This is a further practical move by Western Union leaders towards placing the defence of their five countries - Britain, France, Belgium, Holland and Luxembourg - on a unified footing. First step towards the eventual standardisation of equipment and battle techniques.

Both troops belong to regular A.A. Command regiments. Their visit is expected to last several months. Britain's gunners sharpen the front teeth of Western Union defence.
