HORIZONTAL FLYER ATTACKS WORLD RECORD

Meet a man who plans to defy the law of gravity!

Bob Berry, 40-year-old Manchester garage owner, is a motor-cyclists with a difference. Not for him this sissy stuff of riding along on the part of the body nature provides for that purpose. Mr. Berry mounts his Brough Superior speedster the normal way, but he doesn't ride it like that. At Pendine Sands, Berry attacks the world motor cycle record - riding horizontally.

Hampered by a strong wind, Berry is forced to give up. His best time - 140-miles-an-hour, 30 less than the record. Setting up a record of a different kind are two other motor-cyclists, John Neeler and son Roland. Theirs is a design that is likely to revolutionise everything on two wheels. Simplicity itself to disassemble, the engine is operated on the beam-principle, guaranteed to ensure perfect balance and greatly improved power. Born in a Ruislip backroom garage, the bike will sell at £200 - plus a little extra for Sir Stafford. Already there are 2,000 orders - many from overseas. Running 100 miles to the gallon, here is a bike that will tell the proud story of British workmanship wherever it goes.
